



## **ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR PIM TEUNISSEN**

Pim Teunissen, M.D., Ph.D., combines a career as a clinician with research in medical education. He is a certified maternal-fetal-medicine specialist at the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at the VU University Medical Centre in Amsterdam. He combines this with a position as associate professor at the School of Health Professions Education (SHE) at Maastricht University. After finishing his Ph.D. on workplace learning in graduate medical education in 2009, Dr. Teunissen used his clinical experience as a resident and subsequently as a medical specialist to continue to inform his research and vice versa. In his research he focuses on connecting concepts and methodologies from different scientific disciplines to pertinent issues within healthcare education. His research activities now span the continuum from medical students to new consultants in a variety of specialties. He supervises Master students in Health Professions' Education and Medicine. He is part of the formal supervisory team of eleven on-going Ph.D. projects and has supervised five Ph.D. students to completion. Dr. Teunissen has published more than 60 scientific articles and book chapters. He reviews for many leading journals in the field of medical education. He is honoured to have won the New Researcher Award 2009 awarded by the Association for the Study of Medical Education (ASME) in Edinburgh, UK and to have received the Best PhD thesis award 2008 & 2009 from the Netherlands Association for Medical Education (NVMO), in 2010. He is regularly invited for seminars and lectures both in the

Netherlands and abroad on topics related to workplace learning and clinical teaching. His ambition is to be a researcher/clinician who contributes, through high quality science, to a better understanding of pressing issues in the domain of health professions' education that help to inform innovative solutions.
