I then held several roles in the MBChB programme - Director of Assessment, Deputy Head and then Head (until 2022). I was Editor of the journal, Focus on Health Professional Education from 2015-2020, and have been a Deputy Editor for Medical Education since 2024.

	<p>Between 2005 and 2014 I held positions within ANZAHPE and was scientific chair for two conferences. In 2016 I received a university award for sustained excellence in teaching. I was on the organising committee for the 2024 Ottawa conference. <b>Research (long text)</b>	<p>I have an eclectic mix of research activity and publications which includes: qualitative and quantitative methodologies, health professional education and clinical practice. Skills-based research has been a major focus. Much of my output has been in collaboration locally, regionally or internationally (e.g. UK, Australia, North America, Hong Kong &amp; Japan).</p> <p>Current research includes aspects of clinical skills, assessment, professionalism, wellbeing and careers. <b>Teaching (long text)</b>	<p>I have been involved in undergraduate and postgraduate education for 30 years. Undergraduate teaching has mainly focussed on clinical and professional skills. In the UK, I held the inaugural Sir Siegmund Warburg Lectureship in Communication Studies. In NZ I have designed and delivered clinical skills curricula, developed assessments and contributed to the professional domain of learning. Previously I co-convened the MMedSc(GP) at Birmingham University and was involved in GP Training. I helped to establish and contributed to the Auckland ClinEd programme.
