<b>Biography</b>	Lucy Chipchase is a Professor with the College of Nursing and Health Sciences. After receiving her Diploma of Physiotherapy in 1985, she was a physiotherapist with St Peters Hospital in the United Kingdom before moving to Australia and practicing across several states in Australia. Concurrent with running a private practice she completed a Masters of Applied Science in 1993 and then a Doctor of Philosophy (Physiotherapy Education) in 2007. Previously, Professor Chipchase has held academic positions with the University of South Australia, University of Queensland, Western Sydney University and University of Canberra before joining the team at Flinders University in 2019.
<b>Research (long text)</b>	Her research covers curriculum design, assessment and learning innovations, graduate preparedness,

	<p>chronic pain and the health care experience of CALD and migrant communities. She has published 136 papers in peer-reviewed journals and has been the chief investigator over 30 research grants. In her broad experience within healthcare, Professor Chipchase has demonstrated her strong advocacy for culturally responsive practice, cultural diversity and advocacy for women. She has also shaped how the physiotherapy profession adapts and develops contemporary learning and teaching practices.</p>
<b>Teaching (long text)</b>	<p>In the last 4 years, Professor Chipchase has held executive leadership roles (Deputy Dean, Dean Education, Dean People and Resources). She currently provides strategic leadership of the College of Nursing and Health Sciences' industry partnerships and engagement where she drives the development, implementation and review of practice and engagement initiatives, focused on the nexus between education, research and practice.</p>
